

Buckstones Community Primary School- Pupil Premium Expenditure

Pupil Premium Report for Parents

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011, and paid by means of a specific grant based on school census figures for pupils registered as eligible for Free School Meals in reception to Year 11. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils. The Pupil Premium is additional to main school funding and it will be used by this school to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible by ensuring that funding reaches the pupils who need it most.

In Buckstones:

23 pupils are entitled to Pupil Premium in 2015-2016

Allocation for 2014-2015 was £27,300

Allocation for 2015-2016 is £30,520 (this includes money allocated for the LAC children).

At Buckstones the funding is used in two ways:

1. to raise attainment through the employment of extra teaching assistants to ensure smaller group learning for reading, writing and maths.

Cost: £32,648 2015-2016

2. to provide enriching experiences to promote confidence, for example brass lessons and school trips and residential trips.

Cost: £600 2015-2016

Progress of Pupil Premium Pupils:

At Buckstones 100% children of Pupil Premium met the expected level in the Phonics screening test.

In 2015 KS1 results 100% of Pupil Premium children attained Level 2b+ in Reading and Writing and in Maths. 100% of LAC attained Level 2b in Reading and Level 2c in Writing and Maths.

In 2015 KS2 results 100% (5children) of Pupil Premium children attained Level 4+ in Reading, Maths, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Writing. 80% children attained Level 5+ in Reading and Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation. 20% attained Level 5+ in Writing and Maths. 20% attained Level 6 in Maths and Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation.

The school receives funding for 23 children at the moment who are on Free School Meals. Please do apply for Free School Meals if you think that you might be eligible.
