Adverbs may be divided into different **types**.



A man was **happily** walking through the woods.

An adverb of **manner** tells us **how** something happened.



A few minutes **later** he stopped in his tracks.

An adverb of **time** tells us **when** something happened.



In front of him **there** stood an enormous bear.

An adverb of **place** tells us **where** something happened.
