Rabbits are small animals with short,

furry tails and long ears. Their long ears help them to hear things from far away. Rabbits can hear things from 2 miles away. Rabbits thump their foot on the ground if there is danger, to warn other rabbits to stay away.



Wild rabbits tunnel into the ground to make their homes.

These tunnels are called warrens. They also have lots of entrances for a quick escape if they need it. Rabbits like to live in a group with male rabbits called bucks, female rabbits called does and baby rabbits called kittens.



Rabbits like to eat fruit and vegetables. During warmer weather, rabbits will eat weeds, grasses, clovers, wildflowers and vegetables. When the weather turns cold, rabbits will munch on twigs, buds and any vegetables that they can find.

Rabbits are small mammals with short, fluffy tails, whiskers and long ears.
Rabbits also have powerful legs which they use when they need to escape a predator, such as an owl or eagle. There are more than 30 different types of rabbits all around the world. Small rabbits (known as pygmy rabbits) can be as little as 20cm long, whilst larger rabbits can be up to 50cm long. One breed of rabbit, known as a Flemish giant, grew to 129cm long (about the height of an 8-year-old child!)



## Where Do Rabbits Live?

Rabbits live in habitats such as meadows, woods, forests and even deserts. They are sociable animals and like to live in groups. A group of rabbits will be made up of males (known as bucks) and females (known as does). Baby rabbits are called kits or kittens. When a baby rabbit is born, they have their eyes closed and they do not have any fur. Most rabbits live in underground burrows or rabbit holes. A group of burrows is known as a warren.

# What Do Rabbits Eat?

Rabbits are herbivores, which means they eat fruit and vegetables. Their diet includes grasses, clovers, broccoli and Brussels sprouts. Rabbits will also eat fruits, seeds, roots, buds and tree bark.
